BU conducts **GATE** Conference

Aimed to bring together an estimated 100 academe, researchers, extension service implementers and interested entities to a venue in presenting updates on both local international education trends in higher education, American University Sovereign Nations(AUSN) and **Bicol** University jointly held a Global **Technologies** Alternative **Education (GATE) Conference** at Casablanca Hotel on October 26-27, 2016.

The conference brought in new perspectives and insights on interesting topics to include Internationalization of Higher Education by Ms. Nelly Wadsworth, director of International Education Center, Fitchburg State University, Massachusetts, USA; Bio-ethics in Education by Prof. Daryll R.J. Macer, president of American University of Sovereign Nations, Arizona, USA; HEIs Contribution to Local Development through Research-based Extension Programs by Ms. Agnes M. Espinas,

director Prof. Jonalou S.J. Labor of the University of the Philippines-Diliman. Furthermore, it opened opportunities for partnerships and direction for innovation of policies in instruction, research along publication and extension.

Eleven local researchers presented paper entries along teaching and technology, research – based extension projects, curriculum research and development for best paper competition. Dr. Nicanor B. Balbin of BU College of Industrial (BUCIT) emerged Technology for the first best paper award on "Development and Evaluation of Refrigerant Recovery, Recharge and Vacuum Pump Apparatus with Refrigerated Cooling System. Second in rank was the presentation on "Sex Disaggregated Data of the Teaching and Non-Teaching Personnel of Bicol University for 2013: An Explanatory Study" by Dr. Dolores D. Laguilles of BU College of Social Sciences and Philosophy. Prof. Jayson Abrigo of BUCIT obtained third place for "Hydro-Pneumatic Power Brake

BUCAF Conducts Training Workshop on Postharvest Quality Management and Marketing of Upland Rice

The on-going Project of BU College of Agriculture and Forestry (BUCAF) entitled, "Technology **Development Promotion** and for the Conservation, Production and **Commercialization of Indigenous** Organic Upland Rice in Selected Areas in the Bicol Region" (Bicol Upland Rice Project) conducted Training Workshop **Postharvest Quality Management** and Marketing of Upland Rice on October 19, 2016 at Barangay Oma-oma, Ligao City.

The training, attended by 50 upland rice farmers, aimed to provide knowledge and skills on different post-harvest technologies on upland rice including packaging and pricing. Accordingly, the topics discussed include: Concept and principles of agricultural product commercialization, Post harvest handling and packaging technology for upland rice, and Marketing and Pricing of Upland Rice Product. For the hands-on activity, the following were done: determining the different grades of milled upland rice, packing rice for market, and determining the marketable price of the product.

The farmer-participants are members of Farmers Associations from the two upland barangays of the City, covered by the said Project: Abella and Oma-oma. These barangays traditionally grow various cultivars of indigenous upland rice as one of their major produce. The team from BUCAF,

As agreed upon and as an output of the training, the Farmers Association of the two barangays will manage the collection, packaging and marketing of upland rice produce for its sustained commercialization. Marketing of the products is targeted to start the coming month of November this year with the BU community as the initial target market..

Bicol Upland Rice Project is a two-year research cum extension undertaking that started in February, 2915 with funding support from the Bureau of Agricultural Research of the Department of Agriculture (DA-BAR) in line with the government's agenda on food sufficiency and sustained income generation of farming communities.
